





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PROGRAM UPDATES

SPORTING MEMORIES

o finish off a busy October for Sporting Memories, Sonny Morey was a guest speaker at Holden Hill Men's Shed.

Recently Sonny was inducted into the SANFL Hall of Fame, and has an amazing story, beginning from when he was taken by authorities as a young boy in Alice Springs, and is part of the Stolen Generations. A proud Aboriginal man, Sonny reminisced on his journey from when he was first separated from family, and shared many of the emotions he felt along his journey.

In 2018 Sonny was in Alice Springs with the authors of his biography when he made contact with a French nun, who had been searching for him on behalf of his mother many years earlier, and thought he was a 'ghost', as she could not find him. Sonny was overcome with emotion as he had always wondered why his mother had never looked for him, but found closure after this serendipitous meeting with the nun, who also was relieved to finally meet the man who had been so elusive.

This story and others, especially his football adventures, proved popular with the 60-strong

audience, which elicited many questions from the floor. Two placement students, Stephanie and Heather, were also in attendance, as was one of Sonny's cousins, who he had never met before. One of the participants from the Men's Shed also had a connection, as he lived next door to the sister of one of Sonny's authors of his biography! What a small world we live in!

hroughout my placement at Sports United I have been working at Adelaide West Special Education Centre with SportsUnited's Supporting Success program. This has been an amazing learning opportunity, and making connections with the kids has been the most rewarding aspect of the program so far.

Throughout my placement I have learnt about the various ways of communication with non-verbal children and have even learnt some sign language, most notably how to say my name! It has been extremely interesting to see how each activity at supporting success serve different purposes for the children's overall well-being, for example musical chairs is not only a fun party game but encourages the kids to listen out for cues and move their bodies as well as to dance and have fun. Over the course of the term the kids at Adelaide West slowly became more and more comfortable with us, allowing for each placement student to make a connection with the kids, in turn the placement students have learnt each child's needs and have learnt their unique ways of communicating.
