




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PROGRAM UPDATES

t was a huge day at Elizabeth Oval on November 14, when 23 participants from Holden Hill Men's Shed attended a Sporting Memories tour.

The day started out with an inspection of the newly completed Central District Football Club's women changerooms, followed by the viewing of the huge facilities under the grandstand. Besides the men's changerooms, the participants visited the gym, where no one could lift some of the weights the players regularly use! But, at least they could remember when they could! As a special treat, the upstairs area which included many of the club's historic photos, was used for a bit of fun conversation and interesting quiz questions – some curly ones were thrown out as well of course! Then it was out to the oval area, to check out the pickets, where every player who has pulled on the boots at league level for the Bulldogs is located, and other interesting areas, such as the 'Gowans' ends and the Kris Grant Grand Stand.

Through most of the tour at this point, former champion Central District player Robin Mulholland added to the experience with many interesting 'tales' from the early years of the club. Some of the best stories Robin told was about team-mate Sonny Morey, who was a recent guest speaker at the Holden Hill Men's Shed. i, my name is Heather, and I am a UniSA student who undertook placement with SportsUnited. Initially, understanding effective communication whilst working with the students independently was challenging to begin with. Consistently working with the same student week after week enabled me to recognise behavioural shifts and their ability to express emotions, whether it be over stimulation, the need for space, or even moments of happiness. It has become obvious to me that building strong connections and establishing trust with the students I have been working closely with is a process that doesn't happen instantly.





Overall, my time working with SportsUnited has been incredibly fulfilling and is an experience I will cherish forever. The connections and relationships I made with the students I worked with holds a special place in my heart, and I take great pride in knowing I could be patient, empathetic, and a true friend to these children. I also enjoyed assisting them in developing important life skills such as encouraging positive social interactions, counting, sharing, developing coordination, and working in a team through diverse sporting activities and games. I will always be appreciative of the rewarding experience I gained from my placement with SportsUnited, working with the other placement students, and for having Kat as my mentor. The impact SportsUnited is clearly having on the students at Adelaide West is something I feel so proud to have been a part of.
